

Public Ports - US

Ports have strong financial resilience to manage coronavirus pressures

Restrictions on cargo flows and cruise sailings have already reduced throughput, and sharply contracting demand will further pressure US public ports' revenue. However, US ports' credit quality benefits from high levels of guaranteed annual payments from tenants — minimum annual guarantees (MAGs) — that support overall revenue stability amid periods of volatility. The value of these revenue guarantees depends on tenants remaining financially stable and having the resources to meet their contractual obligations. Accordingly, ports' debt service coverage and liquidity are key credit features that enable them to manage revenue disruptions and other extraordinary challenges in this period of unprecedented stress.

- » Significant decline in cargo and cruise will stress port operators, but landlord model will temper immediate impact for most rated ports. Port operators and customers will face significant pressure as throughput materially declines in the months ahead. The cargo decline will likely approach or exceed the roughly 20% decline of the 2008-09 global financial crisis. Cruise traffic, under 10% of revenue for the sector in aggregate but 40% or more of revenue for certain ports, remains suspended. However, most US ports are organized as landlords and receive 40%-70% of revenues in the form of guaranteed payments under long-term leases from tenants. The landlord model has historically proven to stabilize revenues in periods of volume declines.
- » Strong liquidity bolsters ability to manage revenue disruption; all ports have cash to cover 12 months of debt service and operating expenses if revenues decline 50%. Port credit profiles are buttressed by robust liquidity that enables coverage of operating and debt service expenses under extreme, and potentially protracted, stress
