PRIME LOCATION

The Port of Brownsville's proximity to Mexico, and the rest of Latin America, uniquely positions the port to serve as the transshipment gateway delivering goods and materials to nearby multinational manufacturing centers on both sides of the border.

More than 10 million consumers are within a three-hour drive of the port, with many of those located across the border.

The Port of Brownsville is the largest land-owning public port authority in the U.S. with approximately 40,000 acres. The District's boundary lines stretch to the Rio Grande River, making it the only deepwater seaport directly on the U.S.-Mexico border.
